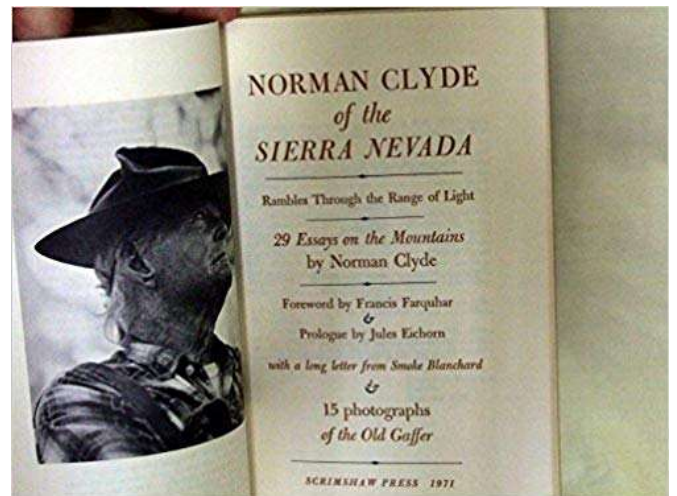

annotations and some additional illustrations.

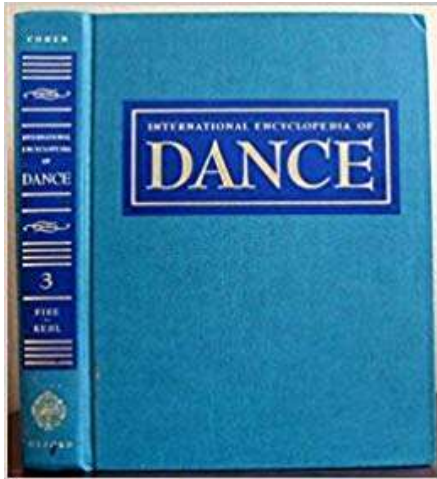

International Encyclopedia of Dance

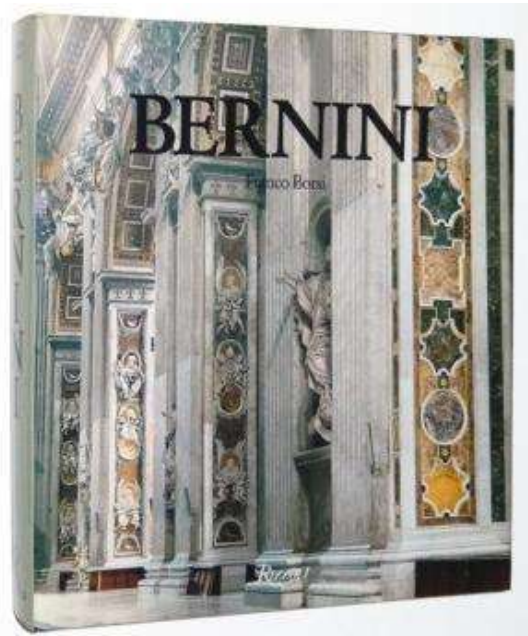

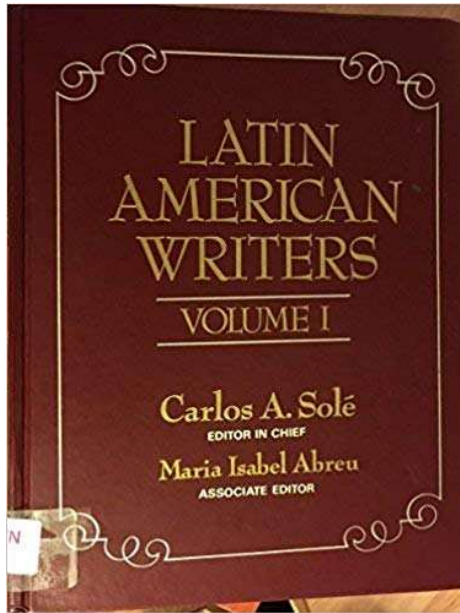

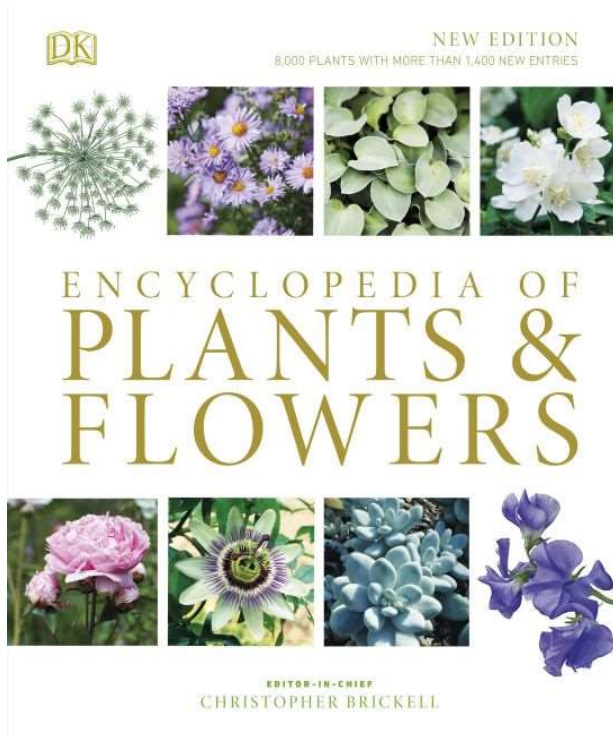




Latin American Writers

3 volumes plus supplement

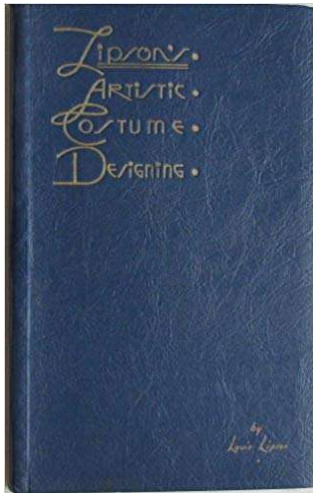

Lipson's Artistic Costume Designing

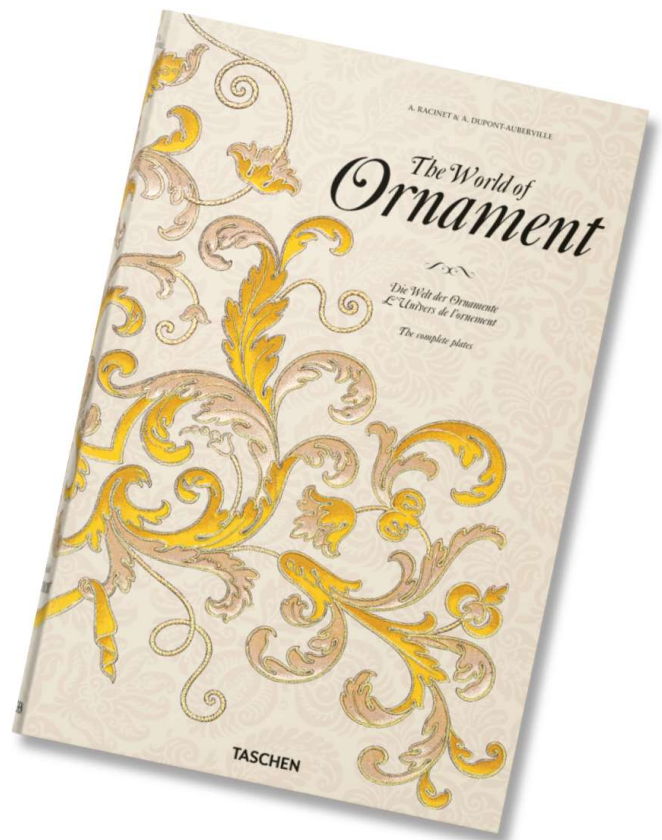

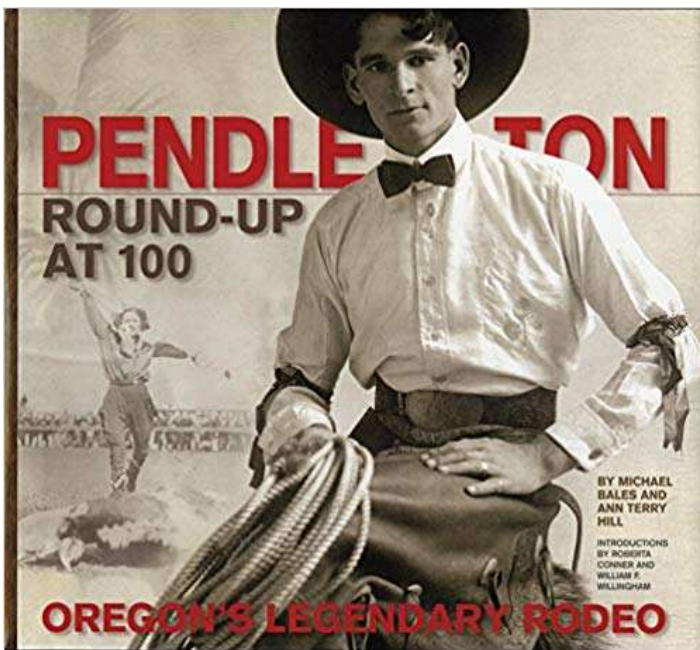


Chado: The Way of Tea

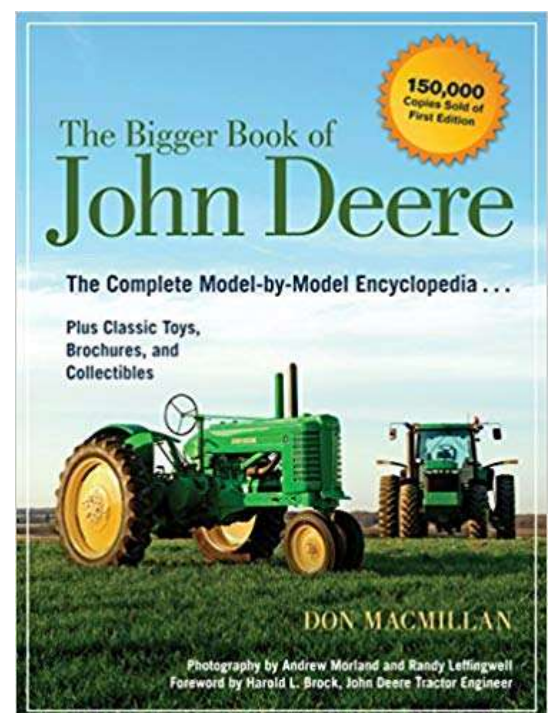


Pendleton Round-Up at 100: Oregon's Legendary Rodeo
